

## Baptist Bikers of Kentucky Benefit Ride

Many of you have seen and heard of the recent challenges that Sunrise Children's Services is having with our Governor, in that the State is not renewing the contract with Sunrise to serve Ky children. Sunrise has been serving children in Ky since 1869, and is one of our Ky Baptist agencies. Since the breaking of this news, Ky baptist have been seeking ways to help Sunrise. One of these ways is with Baptist Bikers. Baptist Bikes have put together a benefit ride called "Ride to the Ranch.

The Benefit ride has set a goal of \$10,000. To reach this goal the Baptist Bikers are asking churches to give \$100 as a gift to Sunrise. If one hundred churches will participate the goal can be reached. Our association will be joining together with other near by associations to help reach this goal. If you are a Biker and would like to participate in the ride, the date of the Ride is September 4

beginning at 10:00am. The starting location will be at the Rockcastle Baptist Association office. The group will travel HWY 25 N to Berea and stop at the Liberty Avenue Baptist Church to join additional riders and have prayer. From there, continuing on HWY 25 to Richmond and then toward Irvine and travel to the Boonesville Baptist Association, where they will be greeted by Sunrise team members.
